ACES ACCESS - Adult Career & Community Empowerment Support Services

The ACES ACCESS program is the division of Area Cooperative Educational Services (ACES) that serves adults 21 years old and older with developmental and physical disabilities in the Greater New Haven area. The ACCESS program lives ACES mission to transform lives through education, innovation and leadership. ACES ACCESS provides hope, purpose and structure for our individuals through vocational training and job placement, enrichment activities, and creating meaningful connections to the community.

The ACES ACCESS program has three main program facets: Day Support Option, Group Supported Employment, and Individualized Support. The individuals' needs and interests determine the placement in one of the program facets.

Day Support Option (DSO): The DSO has two areas: 1. Small-Group DSO and 2. One-to-One DSO for individuals needing more significant support. Individuals in our DSO program participate in community outings and enrichment activities.

Group Supported Employment (GSE): ACCESS' GSE division provides job training and assessments, job placement and on-site support. ACCESS individuals work in a wide variety of job sites, from small family-run businesses to large companies. In addition to external job placement, ACES ACCESS offers individuals training and work opportunities in ACCESS' created and operated businesses: United Lawn Care, ACCESS Commercial Cleaning, Designs by ACCESS – a décor and craft business, and ACES Shines, a shoeshine business.

Individual Supports: ACCESS Individual Supports include Individual Supported Employment, Individual Vocational, and Individual Community. Individual Supported Employment assists individuals in obtaining and maintaining competitive employment. Individual Vocational provides training and guidance to individuals as they prepare to enter the workforce. Individual Community provides enrichment and support to individuals in community-based settings.
