## Provider Description

### Information provided by the provider describing their agency:

St. Vincent's Special Needs Services was founded in 1955 as a United Cerebral Palsy affiliate to provide therapeutic services and a private, special education program for children with cerebral palsy. Adult day programs were established in the early 1980's to meet the needs of graduating students still requiring daily intervention and supports for activities of daily living and employment. In 1985, residential services for adults were added with the opening of the organization's first group home. The organization became a subsidiary of St. Vincent's Health Services in Bridgeport in 1987. Today, SVSNS is a major provider in Southern Connecticut of services for individuals with multiple developmental disabilities and complex medical needs, from birth through the senior years. In partnership with the Department of Developmental Services, SVSNS offers day programs to approximately 125 adults in Stratford, and operates group homes in Trumbull, Stratford, Bridgeport, Shelton, Monroe and Newtown. SVSNS operates a state-certified school program and is an approved provider of Birth-to-Three services. SVSNS also operates residential settings with 24/7 nursing care for children with multiple developmental disabilities and complex medical needs with support from the Department of Children & Families. SVSNS has a staff of over 250 professionals and para-professionals providing services to nearly 400 children and adults and their families each year. (Census: 62; 125 Day)
