What is SCEF?

- New renewable energy projects up to 25 MW per year for 6 years
- Developers submit "bids" in response to the utilities' request for proposals
- Projects are evaluated and then ranked in order of bid price, with bid preferences applied
- Projects are chosen by lowest evaluated cost and enter 20-year agreements
- Bill credits for energy produced by SCEF projects are applied to participating customers' bills



Bid Preferences

- Promote state policy goals
- Allow projects to be evaluated at a lower bid price for ranking purposes
- Bid preference in Program Years 1&2 for projects sited on landfills and brownfields
 - 20% lower bid price
- Program Year 3 considerations: environmental justice communities, resilience, and others
