

- Round 5 Request for Nominations - FHWA Alternative Fuel Corridor Program
- US-7 is EV-ready from Norwalk to New Milford
- 3 eligible fast chargers located in Darien, Danbury, and New Milford
- Connects I-95 and I-84, two major highways and existing EV corridors
- Our coalition will be submitting the draft application to CT DOT who will then submit to FHWA
