TCI-P is Needed to Attract Federal Infrastructure Investment

As Congress debates new infrastructure spending, states like Connecticut may soon have a historic opportunity to capture federal funding for clean transportation investments. Rather than reducing the need for TCI-P, this federal spending will make TCI-P even more critical as a source of state or local matching funds for federal grant programs. Analysis of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) that recently passed the U.S. Senate indicates that funds allocated by formula or through national competition will in most cases require state or local matching funds. In total, we estimate there could be \$1B to \$1.3B in matching funds needed to receive federal funds just under the programs highlighted below. There may be additional programs that would align with TCI-P that would also require matching funds.

The state formula funds require a 20% match. Of these state formula funds approximately \$4.521B could reduce transportation emissions and therefore could be matched with TCI-P funds. A total of \$944.3M will be required to meet the 20% match. The list below is not an exhaustive list of all potential program funds for which TCI-P funds could be used as a match.

For the **national competitive federal programs** below, assuming the state and municipalities (as applicable) can win 1% of these funds, the **expected awards would be \$741M**. This would require **matching funds ranging from 20% to 50% or \$148M to \$370M**. The list below is not an exhaustive list of all potential program funds for which TCI-P funds could be used as match. Connecticut will learn more about the programs if the bill is passed and once U.S. DOT. develops the programs.
