Notice of Extension for Applications for the Energy Efficiency Board
September 14, 2021

The Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (DEEP) hereby issues this Notice of Extension for Applications for the Energy Conservation Management Board, now commonly known as the Energy Efficiency Board (EEB).
