Winter Fun Facts

All animals need food, water, shelter, and space, even in winter! Food can be seeds, berries, overwintering insects, or other animals.

Birds often flock together in winter. This helps them find food easier and may protect them from predators. Common winter birds in Connecticut include chickadees and woodpeckers.

Evergreen trees and leaf litter provide shelter for animals. Loose bark can shelter the tiniest animals, such as insects and spiders. Springtails can sometimes be seen peppering the snow.

There are always signs of animals in winter, including tracks, old nests, and food scraps such as acorn shells left on a rock or log used as a squirrel's "table".
