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Family Violence Summary 2020

- Family violence incidents reported by police in calendar year (CY) 2020 totaled 15,500, a decrease of 6.2 percent compared to the 16,522 reported in CY 2019.
- The 15,500 family violence incidents reported in CY 2020 involved 32,636 participants. Victims totaled 15,324 and offenders totaled 13,879. A total of 3,433 individuals were involved in incidents where all participants were arrested.
- There were 23 family violence homicide incidents in 2020 resulting in 29 deaths; 24 victims and five offender suicides.
- Reported offenses in CY 2020 equaled 25,953 a decrease of 5.0 percent compared to the 27,323 reported in CY 2019. Breach of peace/disorderly conduct accounted for 44.8 percent of total offenses (11,632) and assault accounted for 23.1 percent (5,986).
- Females were the victim of 64.6 percent of all offenses (16,770); males were the victim of 35.4 percent of all offenses (9,183).
- Individuals in a dating relationship were most commonly participants in family violence incidents, 36.6 percent of total incidents (5,667).
- Intimate partner arrest incidents (11,854) accounted for 76.5 percent of total family violence arrest incidents (15,500) during CY 2020, the same percent as CY 2019.
- Intimate partner dual arrest incidents (1,253) accounted for 8.1 percent of total family violence arrest incidents (15,500) during CY 2020, down from 8.3 percent in CY 2019.
- Intimate partner dual arrest incidents (1,253) accounted for 10.6 percent of total intimate partner arrest incidents (11,854) during CY 2020, down from 10.9 percent in CY 2019.
- A weapon was used in 64.2 percent of family violence incidents. A weapon is defined as any object, instrument, device or part of the anatomy used in an attack. Hands, fist, feet, or other parts of the anatomy were used as a weapon in 55.7 percent of total incidents (8,635). Firearms were used as a weapon in 108 incidents, 0.7 percent of total incidents (15,500) and 1.1 percent of incidents involving a weapon (9.944).
- An injury was sustained by 35.1 percent of family violence victims, with minor injury being the most common injury (6,399 victims). An injury is classified as minor when the victim does not suffer obvious, severe or aggravated bodily injury involving apparent broken bones, loss of teeth, possible internal injury, severe laceration, or loss of consciousness.

- The most frequent hour of family violence incidents was between 9:00 p.m. and 9:59 p.m., when 1,052 of the incidents occurred.
- The most frequent day of family violence occurrences was Sunday, 16.3 percent of total incidents (2,525) followed by Saturday, 15.9 percent (2,469). Historically, most family violence incidents occur on either Sunday or Saturday.
- The most frequent month of family violence occurrences was July, 9.6 percent of total incidents (1,494). Warm weather months, May through September, typically have the most family violence occurrences, with the specific month varying from year to year.
- The age cohort of 25-29 years had the highest number of family violence participants, 5,087 (15.6 percent). Specifically, there were 2,038 victims, 2,390 offenders, and 659 participants who were both the victim and the offender.
- In 74.3 percent of family violence incidents there was no court order of protection in place.
- Children less than 18 years of age were involved in 1,352 incidents (8.7 percent of total incidents) and the victims of 1,724 offenses (6.6 percent of total offenses).
- New Haven had the largest number of reported family violence arrest incidents, 1,696. Hartford (1,043) and Waterbury (750) followed.
- Norwich had the highest offense rate per 100,000 population, 2,330. New Haven (1,981) and Ansonia (1,932) followed.

Overview

The calendar year (CY) 2020 Family Violence Arrest Report contains information on the number of family violence arrests occurring during CY 2020 which were reported to the Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection, State Police Division, Crimes Analysis Unit, by Connecticut law enforcement agencies prior to August 2, 2021. As defined in Connecticut General Statute 46b-38d(b), "Each police department, including resident troopers and constables, shall report all family violence incidents where an arrest occurs to the Commissioner of Emergency Services and Public Protection, who shall compile statistics of family violence crimes and cause them to be published annually in the Connecticut Uniform Crime Report."

Police in Connecticut are required to make an arrest whenever they respond to a call that involves family violence and there is enough probable cause to affect an arrest. As defined in Connecticut General Statute 46b-38a(1), "Family violence" means an incident resulting in physical harm, bodily injury or assault, or an act of threatened violence that constitutes fear of imminent physical harm, bodily injury or assault, including, but not limited to, stalking or a pattern of threatening, between family or household members. Verbal abuse or argument shall not constitute family violence unless there is present danger and the likelihood that physical violence will occur. "Family violence crime" does not include acts by parents or guardians disciplining minor children unless such acts constitute abuse.


According to Connecticut General Statute 46b-38a(2), "Family or household member" means any of the following persons, regardless of the age of such person: (A) Spouses or former spouses; (B) parents or their children; (C) persons related by blood or marriage; (D) persons other than those persons described in subparagraph (C) of this subdivision presently residing together or who have resided together; (E) persons who have a child in common regardless of whether they are or have been married or have lived together at any time; and (F) persons in, or who have recently been in, a dating relationship.

ANALYSIS

Volume 1987 - 2020

There were 15,500 reported incidents of family violence CY 2020. This represents a 6.2 percent decrease (1,022) from the number reported in CY 2019 (16,522).


Reported Family Violence Incidents 1987-2020



Participants

A review of the 15,500 family violence arrest incidents reported during CY 2020 shows that there were 32,636 participants. A total of 15,324 individuals were identified as victims. A closer look at the victim total shows that 10,289 victims were female (67.1 percent) and 5,035 were male (32.9percent). There were 13,879 individuals identified as offenders. Of the offender total, females accounted for 3,323 (23.9 percent), while males accounted for 10,556 (76.1 percent). Also, 3,433 individuals were identified as both victim and offender (i.e., dual arrest incidents). Of the individuals identified as both victim and offender, 1,615 were female (47.0 percent), while 1,818 were male (53.0 percent).


Offenses

Due to policy changes designed to strengthen family violence data, beginning with CY 2014 all victim offenses occurring in family violence arrests are counted. In previous years, one offense type was recorded for each incident following a hierarchy rule to ensure the most serious offense was counted. Also, there are several changes in the offense categories on the Family Violence Offense Report, form DPS-230-C (Appendix 1), the form that is submitted to DESPP when a family violence arrest is made.

New offenses beginning in CY 2014 include stalking, strangulation, and threatening. Offenses combined on the new version of the form are breach of peace and disorderly conduct. Offenses that were previously combined and now individually counted are violation of court order and other. Offenses with no change are homicide, assault, kidnapping, sexual assault, and risk of injury. While not affecting the incident total, these changes increased the total number reported offenses making the offense count not comparable to previous years.

During CY 2020, the family violence offenses equaled 25,953, a decrease of 5.0 percent compared to the 27,323 offenses reported in CY 2019. Breach of peace/disorderly conduct was the most common family violence offense (11,632) accounting for 44.8 percent of total offenses. The second most common offense was assault (5,986), 23.1 percent of all offenses, followed by violation court order (3,869), 14.9 percent.



Relationships

During CY 2020, individuals in a dating relationship were most commonly participants in family violence incidents, 34.2 percent of total incidents (5,583). Following were other relative residing in home, 20.3 percent of total incidents (3,323), and spouse 15.1 percent of total incidents (2,461). In incidents involving more than one relationship type, all relationships types are counted in the following table.

Intimate Partner Incidents – Intimate Partner Dual Arrest Incidents





IP Dual Arrest Incidents as Percent of Total Family Violence Arrest Incidents





IP Dual Arrest Incidents as Percent Total IP Arrest Incidents




Weapons

In CY 2020, 9,944 or 64.2 percent of total family violence incidents involved a weapon. A weapon is defined as any object, instrument, device or part of the anatomy used in an attack. In an incident involving more than one weapon, all weapons used are counted. When weapons were involved, hands, fist, feet, or other parts of the anatomy were used in larger number of incidents than any other weapon classification, 8,635 or 55.7 percent of total incidents. Persons in a dating relationship were more often the victim in a family violence incident involving hands, fist, feet, or other parts of the anatomy than any other relationship type. Firearms were used as a weapon in 108 incidents, 0.7 percent of total incidents and 1.1 percent of incidents involving a weapon.

Percent of Total Incidents**




Injury

An injury was sustained by 35.1 percent of family violence victims, with minor injury being the most common injury. An injury is classified as minor when the victim does not suffer obvious, severe or aggravated bodily injury involving apparent broken bones, loss of teeth, possible internal injury, severe laceration, or loss of consciousness. Conversely, an injury is classified as serious when the victim does suffer obvious, severe or aggravated bodily injury involving apparent broken bones, loss of teeth, possible internal injury, severe laceration, or loss of consciousness.


Percent Injury Type by Gender



Injury Type - Incidents Involving Firearm





Injury Type - Incidents Involving Knife






Injury Type - Incidents Involving Hands, Fists, Feet, etc.


Total Incidents - Time of Day

Total Incidents/Offenses - Day of Week



Total Incidents/Offenses - Month of Year




The most frequent month of family violence occurrences during CY 2020 was July (1,494). Warm weather months typically have the most family violence occurrences, with the specific month varying from year to year.

In 74.3 percent of family violence incidents there was no court order of protection in place. Conditions of Release are not considered a court order of protection. Conditions of Release for family violence are set by Law Enforcement or a Bail Commissioner upon release from custody and remains in effect until arraignment.

The table below shows offenses and number of incidents containing those offenses by type of protective order. During CY 2020, the most common offense associated with a court order of protection was violation court order followed by breach of peace/disorderly conduct and assault.

Several victim characteristics, while not consistent across all studies, have been associated with renewed abuse after placement of the initial protection order. These include socioeconomic status, presence of biological children with the abuser, race/ethnicity, and prior drug use by the victim.^{1,2,3} Mears³ and Carlson *et al.*² found that the socioeconomic status of the victim is related to increased risk of renewed abuse after a protection order has been placed. Women of very low versus low/medium socioeconomic status experience a significantly lesser decline in reported violence after a restraining order² suggesting that they are at overall higher risk of re-victimization.

The presence of biological children between the victim and defendant may be another important factor to consider. Carlson *et al.*² found that the presence of children increases the odds of reporting re-abuse by a factor of 4.5 in relationships lasting less than five years. Other investigators found that, although the overall abuse risk is not higher, women with children are more likely to experience violence and more likely to be threatened or have property damage.¹

Race of the victim has also been identified as a significant factor in renewed abuse. Black women are at an elevated risk of renewed abuse after legal intervention (PO or arrest of partner for DV incident).^{2,3} More specifically, Mears reported a relative risk of re-abuse of for black women when compared with white women (risk among Hispanics was not higher relative to that among whites).³ Drug use by the victim is also associated with increased re-victimization after legal intervention.³


Several perpetrator characteristics may predict renewed abuse after initiation of a protection order. These include a history of violence or criminal acts,^{1,4,5,6} being male,⁵ youthful age,⁶ less than full-time employment,⁴ substance abuse,^{4,5} and other mental health contact.⁵ Overall, a violent or criminal history is the characteristic most frequently associated with protection order violation. In a limited study by Chaudhuri and Daly,⁴ men with criminal histories all violated protection orders. In addition, the offender's criminal history, including alcohol and drug convictions, has been associated with placement of protection orders⁷ and with continued violence afterward.^{4,5,6}
