

YOUR RIGHTS UNDER TITLE VI OF THE CIVIL RIGHTS ACT OF 1964

Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, is a national law that protects persons from discrimination based on their race, color, sex, or national origin (and other protected groups as required by law) in programs and activities that receive Federal financial assistance.

**IT IS THE POLICY OF THE CONNECTICUT DEPARTMENT OF MOTOR VEHICLES
THAT NO PERSON, ON THE GROUNDS OF RACE, COLOR, SEX, OR NATIONAL
ORIGIN (AND OTHER PROTECTED GROUPS AS REQUIRED BY LAW), BE
EXCLUDED FROM PARTICIPATION IN, BE DENIED THE BENEFITS OF, OR
OTHERWISE BE SUBJECTED TO DISCRIMINATION UNDER ANY CONTRACT,
AGREEMENT, ARRANGEMENT, PROGRAM OR ACTIVITY, PARTICIPATED IN,
FUNDING OR SPONSORED BY THE
CONNECTICUT DEPARTMENT OF MOTOR VEHICLES.**

Any person who believes that he or she, individually, as a member of any specific class, has been subjected to discrimination prohibited by Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, may file a complaint. A representative on behalf of such person may also file a complaint.
