

## PUBLIC MEETING NOTICE

The Department of Transportation (Department) will conduct a Virtual Public Information Meeting concerning the proposed State Project No. 0056-0316: Resurfacing, Bridge Rehabilitation and Safety Improvements on I-95 in the town of Greenwich and city of Stamford on Thursday, January 21 at 6:30 p.m. The meeting will be live streamed via Microsoft Teams Live Event and YouTube Live. A Question and Answer session will immediately follow the presentation. The presentation will be recorded. The live stream of the formal presentation will begin at 6:30 p.m.

The project is identified as State Project No. 0056-0316.

The purpose of this project is to is to rehabilitate the pavement, address roadside safety, and perform bridge rehabilitation to extend the service life of the facility. The secondary purpose of this project is to provide operational and safety benefits and alleviate congestion in the southbound direction at I-95 Exit 3. This project begins at the New York/Connecticut state border on I-95 and extends approximately 6.63 miles to Exit 6. This project proposes to rehabilitate the bituminous pavement and the underlying concrete pavement. This project also includes minor bridge rehabilitation, storm drainage improvements, and upgrades to guiderail and concrete barrier. The deceleration lane at Exit 3 in the southbound direction will be widened and extended to provide operational improvements.

Right-of-way impacts associated with the proposed project are not anticipated.

Construction is anticipated to begin in the fall of 2022, based on the availability of funding, acquisition of rights of way, and approval of permit(s). The estimated construction cost for this project is approximately \$205 Million. This project is anticipated to be undertaken with ninety percent (90%) Federal Funds and ten percent (10%) State funds.

The Public Information Meeting is being held to provide the public and local community the opportunity to offer comments or ask questions regarding the proposed project.
