This table presents HIV Infection cases using the year the person was first diagnosed.

The term HIV Infection is used to refer to three categories of diagnoses collectively:

1 - persons with a diagnosis of HIV infection (not AIDS)

2 - a diagnosis of HIV infection and a later diagnosis of AIDS

3 - concurrent diagnoses of HIV and AIDS.

Note: data for 2020 should be interpreted with caution due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on access to HIV testing & care-related services.
