This table presents HIV infection cases using the year the person was first diagnosed with HIV

The term HIV infection is used to refer to three categories of diagnoses collectively:

- (1) persons with a diagnosis of HIV infection (not AIDS)**
- (2) a diagnosis of HIV infection and a later diagnosis of AIDS**
- (3) concurrent diagnoses of HIV and AIDS**

Rate per 100,000 population based on corresponding years' State-level Bridged Race Estimate

Rates based on reported numbers less than 12 should be interpreted with caution because the numbers have underlying relative standard errors greater than 30% and are considered unreliable

Note: data for 2020 should be interpreted with caution due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on access to HIV testing & care-related services.
