Second Tranche Funding Applications - Superstorm Sandy Disaster Relief for Public Water Systems SUBJECT:

The Disaster Relief Appropriations Act authorized funds for the Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) Community Development Block Grant – Disaster Recovery Program to assist states and local communities that were most impacted by damages from Superstorm Sandy. A Department of Public Health (DPH) circular letter http://www.ct.gov/dph/lib/dph/drinking water/pdf/Circular Letter 6 Community Development Block Grants -Disaster Relief.pdf reminded, or notified, potential eligible stakeholders in effected counties of the opportunity to improve the resiliency of water systems that serve their communities. The letter emphasizes a critical role that public water system adequacy, redundancy, and resiliency has in ensuring continued public health and safety, above all in disasters. Stakeholders are encouraged to work together with the state to identify effective uses of the state's funds.

The CT Department of Housing (DOH) redirects federal disaster relief funds. The DOH has announced that Second Tranche (series) funds totaling more than \$26 million are available for infrastructure projects and improvements to existing infrastructure resiliency to minimize damage from future storms. The minimum amount of funds that can be applied for is \$100,000 and there is no maximum amount. Joint applications are welcome if solving a shared problem requires mutual action. The state http://www.ct.gov/doh/lib/doh/sandy relief docs/substantial amendment cdbg-dr for public comment.pdf substantial amendment for Second Tranche funds reflects the Act's Rebuilding Strategy and recognizes need to build resilient. The DOH's guide http://www.ct.gov/doh/lib/doh/sandy_relief_docs/infrastructure_program_guide_final.pdf indicates that water system hardening is a priority and details the point based criteria used to evaluate the applications. Relevant categories for water resiliency include: (3) mitigation/resiliency of potable water systems (15 Points); (6) project addresses conditions that threaten public health and safety (10 Points); (7) readiness to proceed and complete by the September 30, 2017 spending deadline (Up to 3 Points); (8) satisfy Federal requirement to spend 80% of funds in Fairfield/New Haven Counties (5 Points); (9) project funding commitments are in place (7 Points); (10) satisfy Federal requirement that 50% of funds benefit households at or below 50% of AMI (5 Points); and (11) contribute significantly to long term recovery and economic revitalization (5 Points). We recommend regional planning agencies and municipalities work together with us to identify regional infrastructure significant investment needs now during this unique opportunity.
