RE: Drinking Water State Revolving Fund – Draft Intended Use Plan for State Fiscal Year 2019 Available for Review and Comment

The Drinking Water Section is seeking public review and comment on the Draft State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2019 Intended Use Plan (IUP), which includes the Fundable Project Priority List (PPL). Types of projects eligible for funding include storage tanks, treatment works, and water mains. A Notice of Hearing was formally advertised in major statewide newspapers, minority newspapers, on the Department of Public Health's (DPH) [website](#), and has been filed with the Connecticut Secretary of State's Office for posting on their [Public Meeting Calendar](#).

The Public Hearing will be held on Thursday, June 28, 2018 at 10:00 am at 470 Capitol Avenue, Conference Room A/B in Hartford, CT. Comments may be submitted as indicated in the Notice of Hearing.

The IUP is associated with the Department's annual federal capitalization grant from the United States Environmental Protection Agency. The IUP details the Department's intended utilization of these federal funds and includes drinking water infrastructure projects proposed to receive loans or subsidized loans from the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF).

The formal Public Hearing will be followed by an Open Forum where attendees will have an opportunity to meet directly with DWSRF program staff to answer questions and learn more about the loan program. All testimony provided during the public comment period and during the hearing will be reviewed and considered by the DPH Commissioner prior to finalizing the IUP.
