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I. EXPLANATION OF AMENDMENT #1

The State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2019 Intended Use Plan (IUP) included conditions under which the Department of Public Health (DPH) may amend the annual IUP to include additional projects received after the development of the annual IUP. Section IV.C of the SFY 2019 IUP stated that: "Eligibility Applications received after the March 30, 2018 deadline will be accepted and reviewed for eligibility. Following publication of the finalized annual IUP, the Comprehensive Project List may be amended periodically to include new projects for which Eligibility Applications were received after the deadline. Any amendments to the Comprehensive Project List will be posted on the DPH DWS website for a 30-day comment period before being finalized and incorporated as an amendment into the annual IUP."

This amendment to the SFY 2019 annual IUP adds the following projects to the Comprehensive Project List, based on Eligibility Applications that were received after March 30, 2018. No other changes have been made to the IUP.

As stated in Section IV.C. of the SFY 2019 annual IUP, if a project on the Comprehensive Project List subsequently becomes ready to proceed, it will be considered for funding according to the bypass procedure explained in Section IV.H. or if sufficient funding is available.

This amendment was posted on the DPH website for at least 30 days for public review and comment period. One comment was received from the Town of Glastonbury Health Department (Attachment C.), which is summarized below.

Wendy S. Mis, MPH, RS, Director of Health, Town of Glastonbury Health Department

Ms. Mis's comments offered support for the Manchester Water Department project to extend water main to homes currently served by private wells on Cedar Ridge Dr. in Glastonbury. These private wells have elevated levels of uranium, which pose a health hazard to the residents.

The DPH thanks the Town of Glastonbury for their comment. The DPH has determined that no revisions to the draft SFY 2019 IUP Amendment #1 are necessary as a result of this comment.

One technical correction was necessary to the draft amendment. The "Project #" and "PWSID" for the Willington Ridge Condos - System 2 Emergency Power Generator project were incorrectly listed on the table in the draft amendment. These have been corrected to "SFY 19-13" and "CT1606211", respectively, in this final amendment. This project was listed correctly in both Comprehensive Project List attachments.

Dear Mr. Walden:

I am writing to extend support from the Town of Glastonbury for a project listed on the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Intended Use Plan – Amendment #1. Project PWSID CT0770021, a project of the Manchester Water Department to extend a water main to multiple homes currently served by private wells on Cedar Ridge Drive in Glastonbury, will address a critical public health need for residents. Naturally occurring uranium has been documented in private wells at multiple homes located at the end of the Cedar Ridge Drive cul-de-sac. Uranium levels in exceedance of the EPA standard of 30 μ g/l have been identified in six wells, and two of these six households have documented uranium levels greater than 900 μ g/l. Uranium at these levels poses significant health hazard to residents.

Manchester Water Department has an application in the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Intended Use Plan – Amendment #1 in which they will extend their public water main to provide service to the residents on the Cedar Ridge Drive cul-de-sac. This water main extension will ensure long-term safe drinking water for the residents, and provide substantial public health benefits.

The Town of Glastonbury is in full support of Manchester Water Department's application, and is appreciative of the efforts to protect the health of residents through this project.
