

Subsurface Sewage Disposal System INSTALLER Exam Information

- Exam applications must be completed and submitted to the Department of Public Health (DPH) by their respective due dates. ([Current exam schedule and due dates](#))
- Exam offered 4 times a year (quarterly) at the DPH building in Hartford, CT.
- Exam time allowed is 2 hours; passing grade is 70 or higher.
- Exam questions consist of true/false, multiple choice, fill-in-the blanks, and problem solving based on the CT Public Health Code (PHC) Regulations and Technical Standards for Subsurface Sewage Disposal Systems, as well as experience gained when actively participating in the installation of a septic system.
