This Department has reviewed your approval request for Mutual Industries non-woven filter fabric (Designation #: NW150SP) for covering stone aggregate utilized in subsurface sewage disposal systems installations permitted by Local Directors of Health. The Department's *Technical Standards for Subsurface Sewage Disposal Systems* (Technical Standards) includes a list of approved filter fabrics (Appendix C) that can be updated prior to the next publication of the standards. The Technical Standards were last revised on January 1, 2018.
