BECOME LEAD-SAFE CERTIFIED NOW:

Any contractor—plumbers, electricians, HVAC, & painters included—who disturbs lead paint while working in a pre-1978 home, school or day care center now must be Lead-Safe Certified. If you are not, you can face thousands of dollars in fines. Plus you are putting your health, your workers, their families and your customers at risk that could result in lawsuits.

Visit www2.epa.gov/lead to learn about the dangers of lead paint poisoning and the precautions you can take against it. You will also find an EPA accredited trainer in your area where you can be certified. One 8-hour class certifies you for 5 years. It is that easy.

HERE IS HOW:

- 1. Individual renovators must be certified. Get certified by attending a one day Renovation, Repair and Painting (RRP) Rule Course. The price for this course is set by private trainers accredited by the EPA. To find an accredited trainer near you, visit www2.epa.gov/lead or call: 1-800-424-LEAD (5323)
- 2. Your FIRM must also be certified. Apply for certification by completing and submitting an application and fee.
