SUBJECT:	Things Remembered Recalls Children's Jewelry Due to Violation of Lead Standard

On July 19, 2016, the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) issued a recall of silverplated heart bracelets and gold-plated necklace with three charms; a pink ice cream cone, a pink crystal cupcake, and a tag engraved with the word "SWEET". Both jewelry items were sold at Things Remembered between February 2015 and June 2016. The clear surface coating on the bracelets and necklaces contain lead in excess of the allowable limit. Lead is toxic if ingested by young children and can cause adverse health issues.
