SUBJECT: JM Exotic Foods, Inc. Recalls Ground Turmeric Due to Elevated Levels of Lead

On August 5, 2016 the U.S. Food and Drug Administration issued a recall for turmeric powder produced by J.M. Exotic Foods, Inc. as a result of elevated lead levels found in samples. No amount of lead is safe to ingest.

The turmeric powder was exclusively distributed to a farmer's market in Doraville, GA from May until August 2016. Product information includes: Item Number 1153, packaged in 4 oz. clear plastic clamshells, product codes: Lot# 16131185 and Lot # 16165184.
