Managing Asthma in the Child Care Setting

As with any medical occurrence, be sure to document everything in the child's file.

If a child exhibits signs of an asthma attack, such as:

- Frequent coughs
- Mild wheeze
- ◆ Tight chest
- Unexplained irritability if too young to talk



Then do the following:

- 1. Stop current activity, sit child down and keep child calm.
- 2. Follow the child's Asthma Action Plan (AAP) and administer medications as prescribed OR call 911 and contact parents.

If there is no improvement in 15-20 minutes after initial treatment with medication or ANY of these signs are present:

- Breathing hard and fast
- Nostrils flared
- Ribs show
- Can't talk well
- Lips or fingernails turn blue
- 3. Call 911, follow the emergency instructions on the AAP, and contact parents
