Recap of November meeting</p>	<p>Recap initiatives and group comments</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Hot-spotters/North Carolina Example – what is keeping CT from doing this work now?</i> • <i>Data use case for social determinants of health –</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ <i>DataHaven Community Wellbeing Survey is cross tabulated for social determinants such as transportation, housing, and food insecurity</i> ○ <i>There is a need for a closer look at the way race/ethnicity is being collected, if it is being collected, and consistency of collection. What is the Health Systems Action Team role? Is there overlap with the new Office of Health Strategy?</i> • <i>White paper on data needs for health equity –</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ <i>A health equity report was completed 7-8 years ago and recommendations were made; however, implementation efforts seemed to have slowed/stopped – could look into making recommendations actionable.</i> ○ <i>Could start with an education and comparison component, then white paper could follow as a result.</i> ○ <i>An educational series could be a way to gather content</i> ○ <i>Could engage graduate students in gathering and compiling information</i> • <i>Prevention packages (VT) – crosswalks clinical approach, Innovative Patient-entered Care and/or Community Linkages, along with Community wide prevention strategies.</i> • <i>Health Enhancement Communities/Prevention Services Initiative</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ <i>Health Systems Action Team could become subject matter experts for SIM Health Enhancement Community (HEC) process; HEC's will work to create linkages between payers and providers.</i>

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	<p>Additional discussion on data gaps:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Need to further define and connect to Health Systems • Where are data gaps keeping the SHIP from moving ahead (or showing where we are moving ahead) • Ask each action team what their data gaps are, and how these gaps are hindering meeting their objectives (specifically as they relate to health equity). • Also ask action teams what they think the barriers are to obtaining the data they need • Disparity data – need to have a consistent approach across SHIP • Look at what data others are using • Look at dashboard, then go to action teams • Data lag – are there interim measures available?
