## *History*

### CONNECTICUT VETERANS HALL OF FAME

#### *History*

The Connecticut Veterans Hall of Fame was established to increase the awareness of the lifetime contributions of veterans after completion of honorable military service. The Connecticut Veterans Hall of Fame is not a military hall of fame; instead, it seeks to recognize veterans for the countless contributions to society. Those selected for induction are Veterans who honorably served their country through military service and who continue to serve and inspire their communities and the state.

Each year the committee selects inductees from applications received from across the state and nation. These Veterans have been leaders in a variety of areas such as arts, education, public service, volunteer activities, and community and business leadership. Most importantly, they have all made a significant impact on the lives of others and in their communities.

To be eligible for the Connecticut Veterans Hall of Fame, the nominee must have served their country honorably in a branch of military service, but the focus is on the nominee's continued serve to their communities, Veterans, state, and nation after discharge.

The Connecticut Veterans Hall of Fame is administered and sponsored by the Connecticut Department of Veterans Affairs and the Connecticut Military Department on behalf of the Office of the Governor.

The first class of the Connecticut Veterans Hall of Fame was inducted in November 2005. To date, One Hundred and seventy-six Veterans are honored in the Connecticut Veterans Hall of Fame.

# *Ceremony*

The induction Ceremony will honor each new class of inductees to the Connecticut Veterans Hall of Fame. The Connecticut Veterans Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony will take place annually at the State Capitol. The Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Commissioner of the Department of Veterans Affairs and the Adjutant General of the Connecticut National Guard will preside at the induction of Veterans into the Hall of Fame. Each inductee will be presented with a commemorative medallion and certificate confirming their induction. Their names will then be added to the Connecticut Veterans Hall of Fame Plaque located in the State Legislative Office Building.

## *The Selection Process*

The Connecticut Veterans Hall of Fame inducts Connecticut Veterans each year who have honorably served their country through military service and continue to serve and inspire with their accomplishments throughout their lifetime. An Executive Committee is appointed to select eligible Veterans who have ties to Connecticut. The Executive Committee is chaired by the Commissioner of the Department of Veterans Affairs and comprised of the Adjutant General of the Connecticut National Guard; three appointees selected by the Governor, one of whom will be a member of the Connecticut Veterans Hall of Fame; the co-chairs and the ranking members of the General Assembly's Veterans Affairs Committee. Applications for induction are solicited from all Connecticut citizens and according to the Nomination Guidelines. The application guidelines include, but are not limited to:

- ❖ The nominee must have resided in Connecticut for a minimum of five years.
- ❖ The nominator must provide discharge papers, which verify the honorable military service of the nominee.
- ❖ The nomination packet must contain the nomination form, the discharge papers, and written documentation citing the nominee's service to the community, state, and/or nation as well as a narrative summarizing the nominee's contributions to his or her fellow citizens. Excluding the required documents, the written documentation should not exceed five pages in length.
- ❖ All nomination packets must be received in the Office of the Commissioner of Veterans Affairs, 287 West Street, Rocky Hill, CT 06067 or [tammy.marzik@ct.gov](mailto:tammy.marzik@ct.gov) by 4 pm September 9, 2022 to be considered for the 2022 class.

# *Nomination Guidelines*

2022 NOMINATION PACKET - DEADLINE – September 9, 2022

- A. The Connecticut Veterans Hall of Fame seeks to recognize those Connecticut residents, or former state residents, who have worn the uniform of this Nation’s Armed Forces, performed their military duties, and then continued to contribute to community, state and nation in an exemplary manner. These outstanding contributions may, for example, be in the areas of professional, civic, veteran’s advocacy, political or contributions over the life of the nominee.
- B. Please note: the Connecticut Veterans Hall of Fame is not intended to be a military hall of fame. Sections 1 and 2 are required to confirm eligibility for consideration. Once found eligible, evaluations are based on Sections 3, 4 and 5.
- C. The nominee must meet the following rules:
- a. Must have lived in Connecticut for a minimum of five years.
  - b. Must meet the definition of a “Veteran” as defined under Connecticut General Statutes 27-103.
  - c. Must have received an honorable or general under honorable discharge from the U.S. Armed Forces and provide a copy verifying honorable discharge from the U.S. Armed Forces and/or provide a copy verifying honorable veteran’s service discharge papers (e.g. DD 214) with the nomination packet. If unable to retrieve discharge papers for historical figures, proof of service as evidenced by historical accounts or military history may be submitted.
  - d. Be of good moral character and have no felony convictions.
- D. In order for the submission process to uniformly portray the efforts and contributions of these great Connecticut Veterans, it is recommended that the nomination packet be completed in accordance with the sample format provided.
- E. The nomination packet is not to exceed five (5) 8½” x 11” pages [excluding the nomination form, proof of service and copies of awards or certificates]. Multiple nominations of the same individual are discouraged.
- F. Posthumous nominations are accepted.
- G. Nomination packets and attachments become the property of the Connecticut Veterans Hall of Fame and will not be returned.
- H. Nominations will be reviewed by the Connecticut Veterans Hall of Fame Executive Committee. Recommendations for induction are submitted for approval to the Lieutenant Governor of the State of Connecticut.
- I. Employees of the Governor’s staff, all state elected officials and members of the General Assembly, and the Connecticut Veterans Hall of Fame Executive Committee, are ineligible for induction into the Connecticut Veterans Hall of Fame until two years after they have left their position. The Executive Committee may waive the two-year requirement for nominees over the age of seventy.
