

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



Litchfield Public Schools

- □ Enrollment: K-12: 990 Students
- District Demographics:
 - White: 100%
 - F/R lunch= 12%
- District Area: 59 Square miles of a variety of a variety of community settings:
 - The historic Green, and North and South Streets with large colonial era homes;
 - Large plots of land with huge houses, most full time residents & some part timers, representing significant wealth;
 - Several areas that could be bedroom communities in any municipality;
 - Farms, especially dairy farms;
 - Rural homes on one lane dirt roads, sometimes fairly isolated.
- Budget: \$16,580,641
 - \$16,022 per pupil






