


Purpose:

Process:


- Selection of Districts: Co-Chair Selection
- CCTF Visit: 5-6 CCTF Members will visit the selected district and meet core district personnel (Superintendent, Asst. Superintendent, Curriculum Director, Teacher etc.) to observe, meet and discuss district implementation of the CCSS. Specific activities and personnel will be determined by the Superintendent or designee of the selected district. The CCTF visit should take no more than 2 hours as appropriate.
- Observation Lens: CCTF Logic Framework (Next Slide)
 - Throughout the visit, the CCTF visiting team will use the logic framework to organize district focus points regarding implementation strengths and suggestions




Session VIII Activity 3: Building Recommendations


