How do we make recommendations comprehensive, meaningful, and measurable and promote quality?

- Promote Quality
 - Recognize that improving the quality of health care and outcomes is priority Number 1
 - Emphasize sharing and communicating best practices
 - Utilize data to drive education and health promotion practices
 - Recognize differences in approaches to quality improvement across populations as a means of promoting health equity
- Comprehensive
 - All-inclusive
 - Available in multiple formats
 - Recommendations that relate to the entire health care system so they work to prevent future problems as well as addressing current problems
 - Culturally responsive and applicable to all who need it
 - Universally available
- Meaningful
 - Communications enable consumers to understand their options and exercise their right to challenge financial and medical concerns
 - Recommendations apply to real problems and are appropriate to the issue
 - Not only driven by current tools and processes
 - Recommendations are directly related to use of medication and medication devices
 - Prevent inappropriate or unnecessary use of medications and medication devices
 - Recommendations offer information about prevention and health promotion
- Measurable

- Clear, feasible, adequately resourced outcomes from the beginning, and monitoring/evaluating throughout the process
- Modify in response to findings
- Transparency
- Pre-test communications for effectiveness with all target populations and continue ongoing evaluation when communications are distributed
