Ideas/Recommendations for Consideration:

Difficult to Find Information about DV Offender Standards on CCADV, Judicial and other sites

- How might we create a “name” that is more user friendly and recognizable?
- How might identify the revenue to create a separate site?
- Given limited resources – How do we make information more understandable on the CCADV and Judicial Websites
 - Information on Standards and the Application Process
 - Training Information – Develop and Host Webinars
 - Host Monthly or Quarterly Bulletins
 - How are other states accomplishing this?
- “Do You Need Training?” part of the website to support provider’s with the Standards training requirement
- Last Provider approved in August 2017?
- Send out quarterly an approved provider list for State’s Attorney’s to post
- Seek to Demystify the Standards

Difficult to Meet the Training Requirement of 40 hours

- The DV Offender Standards Advisory Council develop a series of webinars (CCADV has the technology that the Council could use)
- Advertise trainings on the website and through Constant Contacts to provider associations, CT Bar Association
- Help Providers and lawyers meet annual training requirements
- Judge Danher provide a training to Judges? (Linda C)
- MCLE’s? Attorney’s must complete 12 hours of training annually
 - Judicial’s “Calendar Call” project (Linda C)

Difficult to Develop “Buy-In” from Systems Partners

- DV Offender Standards Advisory Council present at CJPAC in March on the October 2018 report?
- Monthly or Quarterly Bulletin to be developed and disseminated to State’s Attorney’s, CSSD, Private Providers
