Monthly Indicators Report

Highlights

- This month's total prison population is 9,648 inmates, a 3% decline from one month ago and a 26% drop from August 1st, 2019 (see Table 2)
- Statewide arrest totals, after initially dipping earlier in the year, have inched closer to prior year levels (Chart 5 on page 4).
- Month over month, pretrial admits increased in July but remain historically low, less than half of those in July 2019 (Table 2a on page 3).
- The drop in the pretrial population relative to July 2019 is more acute for people held on low bonds. The total pretrial population is down by 18% but most of that decline is among those held on bonds less than \$50k and the largest decrease is among those on the lowest bonds, under \$20k. (Table 5 on page 3).
- The number of parole hearings seems largely unaffected by the pandemic. The 131 full panel hearings held in July are nearly on par with 140 held in July 2019 (see Tables 4 and 4a on page 3). Meanwhile, transfer parole cases have come down from all-time highs in April and May but remain double or triple what they have been historically.
- Chart 2a graphs the dramatic decline in the number of inmates held on short sentences at the DOC. Since March of this year, the daily count of inmates held on sentences less than or equal to one year has fallen 77%, the fastest-shrinking segment of the inmate population since the pandemic began.

Prison Population Forecast

The decline in the prison population softened in July, especially compared to prior months. The net drop seen during July (-263) was less than in March (-631), April (-848), May (-528) and June (-468). The inmate population has declined as a function of admits (see chart 6 on page 4) and releases from facilities depicted on chart 2 and table 2a on pages 2 and 3, respectively. As we will see, these two dynamics are slowly shifting as the system responds to the pandemic.

Admissions, after falling to 355 (the lowest level ever recorded) in the month of April, have gradually increased each successive month since. Ticking up in May to 592 and 724 in July, more, albeit, many fewer admissions than would be expected, have contributed to the population falling less abruptly over the last few months.

Releases, particularly, discretionary releases bubbled up in April, reaching 522, but have fallen each month as fewer eligible candidates are available for review. The DOC managed to release 324 sentenced offenders in July (see chart 2 on page 2) despite a much smaller pool of sentenced inmates to draw from (also on chart 2). Further highlighting the change in the sentenced population, Chart 2a highlights the dramatic drop in the number of those held on short sentences.

January 1, 2019 through February 1, 2021




Chart 2 - Criminal justice, monthly counts and flows




Interrupting historical trends, the number of sentenced inmates held at the DOC on sentences of one year or less, has declined significantly in recent months. The chart above tracks the daily count of this subset of the inmate population from January 1 to August 1 in 2018, 2019 and 2020. In 2018 and 2019, the lines change little except for typical, seasonal fluctuations.

A break happened in March 2020. Since then, inmates serving one year or less has fallen 77%, from

1,002 to 229. This group accounts for a disproportionately large fraction of the overall decline seen in the inmate count since the onset of the COVID-19 public-health emergency. Although it was only 8% of the inmate population in mid-March, its contraction accounts for 28% of the overall reduction in the population between March 1 and August 1.

One impact of this contraction is evident in table 3 on the next page, as the DOC's CRU relies on this churning, pool of offenders for cases to review.

First week of the month, avg. daily count (ADC)




Chart 6 – Monthly DOC Admissions

July 2019 through July 2020




Chart 4 – Prison population, first-of-month

2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020




Chart 7 – Remands from community release

July 2020




Chart 5 – Statewide criminal arrests

2019 and 2020





Chart 8 – DOC community supervision
