Monthly Indicators Report

Highlights

- This month’s total prison population of 9,946 inmates represents a 50% decrease from the February 2008 all-time high DOC population of 19,894.
- Arrests continue to track lower than they did a year ago, down 8.8% relative to last June. There were 5,349 arrests in June 2020, versus 5,863 in June 2019.
- After reaching a historic low in April and rebounding in May to 5,115, arrests have been gradually returning to normal operations. (See Chart 5.)
- Despite arrests returning to near parity with prior year figures, pretrial admissions remain substantially lower than in years past. There were 475 pretrial admissions in June 2020 which is a mild increase from the all-time low in April 2020 of 300, but a 60% decrease from June 2019 (1,202).
- For the third consecutive month, sentenced admits are near zero (see chart 2). While releases to the community rose 68% from last June, this month’s releases (548) are slightly lower compared to April (545) and May (548) 2020.
- Total discharges from community supervision were 326 for June 2020, the highest since August 2017 when it was also 326. This signifies that the “back-end” of the system is still working during the COVID-19 pandemic and discharging people from community supervision at comparable rates, even as admissions have shrunk during the public health emergency.

Prison Population Forecast

Although the prison population forecast estimated a modest reduction in population, resulting from continued efforts in the criminal justice system, the acceleration of the drop since the onset of the public-health emergency in mid-March, the the gap between the forecast and the average daily count continues to widen (See Table 1).

As of July 1st, 2020 Connecticut is the first state in the nation to successfully reduce its prison population by 50% from its historic peak in 2008 fulfilling the goal of the national #Cut50 movement.

As mentioned in last month’s Monthly Indicators Report, the prison population would have needed to lose 498 more people in order to achieve a 50% decrease from the population high of 19,894 in February 2008. On July 1, 2020 the total prison population was 9,946. (See Chart 2a on page 2 for a more comprehensive review of this important milestone.)

Since the state has progressed through through phased reopening, several criminal justice and as criminal justice system operations increase activity, it is reasonable to assume Connecticut will not regress on the #Cut50 milestone.

January 1, 2019 through February 1, 2021




Chart 2 - Criminal justice, monthly counts and flows




Chart 2a – Cut50 in Connecticut



In late June, the prison population dipped below 10,000 people for the first time since 1990. Shortly after, on July 1, 2020, the CT DOC reached a second milestone: cutting the total incarcerated population in half from its record high of 19,894 in February 2008. The total prison population drop is a composite of decreases in the sentenced and pretrial populations. The sentenced population dropped 54% from its record high in 2008,

while the pre-trial prison population fell 33% from its' highest point in 2010.

The number of people held in Connecticut's prisons and jails has been in a steady decline since 2008. Impacts from COVID-19 helped rapidly accelerate the rate of decline. The chart above shows that the time to drop of 2,500 inmates decreased from 1,827 to 1,127 to only 182 days, bringing the prison population its current historical milestone much faster than previously anticipated.

First week of the month, avg. daily count (ADC)




Chart 6 – Monthly DOC Admissions

May 2019 through June 2020




Chart 4 – Prison population, first-of-month

2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020




Chart 7 – Remands from community release

June 2020




Chart 5 – Statewide criminal arrests

2019 and 2020





Chart 8 – DOC community supervision
