Annual Recidivism Study	The discussion centered on what is worthwhile to include in the report. There is concern that the data must not only be presented, but also analyzed.  It was decided to determine the format and content of the report after meeting with the CJPAC members to see what they want included. There was a debate as to whether to give possible option of what to include, it was determined that it was better to let them present what they would like to see in the documents. By not giving them options, they will be less inclined to request things that they do not really need.  There was further discussion as to how to make the document the most useful to the greatest number of people. For instance, instead of having one long document, OPM and the SAC might produce a shorter document with detailed supplements for interested parties. It is important to consider the target audience.  Potential formats were compared to those from other states, either Massachusetts or the Maine Juvenile Recidivism Report.
