

WAIVER CODE CHEAT SHEET

WAIVER CODE	USES
Cost to the State of a competitive solicitation process would outweigh the benefits of such a process.	Contract is under \$100,000 and other procurements are better suited for competition
Supplier is mandated by federal law/grant (e.g. Medicaid), state statute, or public act.	Legally binding document dictates a specific vendor/supplier to use for a given service.
Services are provided to prevent disruption in treatment outcomes and continuity of care for vulnerable populations or emergency services.	Unforeseen circumstances that require the state to act quickly OR more time needed for service or RFP
Evidence based, proprietary, special clinical/medical services, or unique/specialized skills.	Supplier has a license/patent or otherwise special or unique ability to provide the service.
Services and location by consent decree, lawsuit disposition, litigation or stipulated agreement.	Court of law mandates the use of a specific supplier.
Specific supplier is funded by State bond funds or resources in real estate or physical plant to provide level of service.	One supplier has bond funding or physical plant investment from State needed for service provision.
Hospitals and universities under agreement provide research and training programs for emergency treatment services.	FOR DMHAS USE ONLY
Zoning, citing, and site licensing prohibit other suppliers due to funding or time.	Specific vendor has facility in location in line with zoning laws.
