## **COURSE ANNOUNCEMENT**

The Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection, Police Officer Standards and Training Council's Field Services Training Division is offering a (2) two-day seminar for Sergeants, Lieutenants, or candidates to these positions on **Supervision**, **Leadership**, **and Mentoring**. The course will be presented, **Monday**, **March 13**, **2023**, **through Tuesday**, **March 14**, **2023**, **from 9:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M.** at the Connecticut Police Academy located at 285 Preston Avenue Meriden, CT 06450.

The seminar focuses on providing students with the techniques, tactics and methods to motivate subordinates to achieve their highest potential. Students will learn the concepts of leadership and the role it plays in their own life, the lives of their subordinates and their organization. Students will learn to mentor their subordinates as a means of preparing them for future leadership roles. Students will leave with a working knowledge of the concepts and practices of quality leadership traits to include the value of mentoring and supervising.
