COURSE ANNOUNCEMENT

The Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection, Police Officer Standards and Training Council's Field Services Training Division, in conjunction with regional police firearm instructors, will be conducting a Basic Police Firearms Instructor Pre-Test for all new applicants for the Basic Police Firearms Instructor course.

The Basic Police Firearms Instructor Pre-Test will be held **Friday, April 08, 2022**, from **8:00 a.m.** to **12:00 p.m.** Upon arrival, applicants are to report to the main lobby at the Connecticut Police Academy. The written test will be administered in the auditorium.

All Basic Firearms Instructor Training Pre-Test applicants must complete:

- A fifty (50) question written test and achieve a passing grade of at least 80% correct.
- A sixty (60) round shooting practical and achieve a passing grade of at least 90% accuracy (270 out of 300).

Successful applicants will be placed on an eligibility list and training supervisors may register the successful candidate for upcoming firearms instructor training programs, over the next two years.

Firearm instructor applicants must have also completed a Methods of Instruction (Basic Instructor Development) course prior to being scheduled for a Basic Police Firearms Instructor course. Applicants who successfully complete the Basic Police Firearms Instructor Pre-Test, but lack the Methods of Instruction prerequisite, will be placed on the waiting list for future training opportunities.

On April 08, 2022, please bring:

- Department issued sidearm
- 100 duty rounds for sidearm
- Full duty leather gear with reloading sources
- Eye and hearing protection
- Baseball cap with round bill
- Protective vests
- Duty rain gear (if necessary)

All applications and applicants will be accepted for the pre-test – a class confirmation will not be sent.

There is no tuition for this course.
