Teachers' Mortgage Assistance Program

The Teachers Mortgage Assistance Program offers home loans at below-market interest rates to Connecticut public school and vocational-technical teachers who are first-time homebuyers. Previous home owners also may qualify for this loan if they purchase a home in a federally targeted area that would benefit from an increase in home ownership.

Federal Shortage Area Programs

Teachers holding certifications in the statedesignated shortage areas may be eligible for:

- targeted teacher deferment for borrowers under the Family Federal Education Loan (FFEL) and Federal Supplemental Loans for Students (SLS) programs [34 CFR 682.210(q)];
- cancellation of up to 100 percent of their debt under the Federal Perkins Loan Program for fulltime teaching in fields of expertise [34 CFR 674.53(c)]; or
- reduction of the teaching obligation for scholars under the Paul Douglas Teacher Scholarship Program [34 CFR 653.50(a)].

Additionally, teaching in a shortage area enables grant recipients under the Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant Program to fulfill their teaching obligations [34 CFR 686.12(d)].
