**SUBJECT: Operational Memorandum No. 4A-21, 4C-21 and 4H-21
CACFP Emergency Operating Costs Reimbursement Program**

Pursuant to Section 722 of Public Law 116-260 of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021, Title VII, Chapter 3 (the Act), the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Food and Nutrition Service offered additional funds to state agencies administering the National School Lunch Program, School Breakfast Program, and Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) to provide local operators of those programs with additional reimbursements for emergency costs incurred during the public health emergency.

Additional funding was awarded to the Connecticut State Department of Education (CSDE) through the CACFP Emergency Operating Costs Reimbursement Program to be distributed to CACFP operators whose revenues declined or were temporarily interrupted during the early months of the pandemic due to COVID-19.

The CSDE determined the amount of funding provided to eligible CACFP operators using a statutory formula established under the Act, as outlined in [USDA Memo CACFP 05-2021](#), *Child Nutrition Program Emergency Operating Costs During COVID-19: Implementation Guidance for State Agencies*.

Attached is the list of CACFP operators eligible to receive the formula-calculated reimbursements for emergency operating costs incurred during the months of March through June 2020. The full reimbursement payment will be provided in one payment.
