

**Connecticut State Department of Education
List of RCCI Eligible Schools - October 2019 Data**

This document provides information on site-eligible schools for the Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program (FFVP) effective February 1, 2020. Schools must have an elementary curriculum in place for grades up to 8. Additionally, schools with any secondary grade levels must ensure only elementary grade levels participate in the FFVP. Schools that are site eligible have 50 percent or more children eligible for free and reduced-price meals. However, site-eligible schools cannot be used in determining if other sites under the CACFP, SFSP, SSO, FFVP, and ASP are eligible. As with area eligible schools, percentages are calculated annually by the Connecticut State Department of Education's (CSDE) Child Nutrition Programs and are based on October data. In districts where the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) is implemented, the free and reduced-price percentage might not be reflective of individual children's eligibility status.
