Interdistrict Magnet Schools: Kindergarten to 12th Grade Students

Families with K-12 grade students attending an interdistrict magnet school (magnet school) in the Greater Hartford Region, please find where you live and when you registered in the two tables on this page for your transportation information.

Where the Student Lives (Resident Town)	Students living in one of these towns: Andover, Avon, Berlin, Bloomfield, Bolton, Bristol, Burlington, Canton, Coventry, Cromwell, East Granby, East Hampton, East Hartford, East Windsor, Ellington, Enfield, Farmington, Glastonbury, Hartford, Hartland, Harwinton, Hebron, Granby, Middletown, New Britain, New Hartford, Manchester, Newington, Marlborough, Plainville, Portland, Rocky Hill, Simsbury, Somers, Southington, South Windsor, Suffield, Tolland, Vernon, West Hartford, Wethersfield, Windsor, Windsor Locks	
Who is Responsible for Transportation	If the student lives in the same town as where the magnet school is located, the town where the student lives is responsible for transportation.	If the student lives in a different town than where the magnet school is located, RSCO Transportation is responsible for transportation.
Students that do not live in one of the towns listed above, select one of the following options:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Contact RSCO Transportation to discuss dropping off and picking up their child from an existing centralized bus stop. Provide transportation to and from the magnet school. Parents/guardians that use this option are eligible to receive a \$5 per day reimbursement, that is based on the student's attendance and is mailed during the summer months. To receive the reimbursement, parents/guardians must: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Transport their child for the entire school year, and Complete an on-line reimbursement form, available at www.crec.org/transportation/forms.php before June 15th 	

When the Student Registers	When the Student's Transportation Starts
Before July 1st	Transportation usually starts on the student's first day of school.
After July 1st	Transportation may not start on the student's first day of school. Parents/guardians should plan to transport their child to and from school until transportation starts.
Returning students	<p>If a student's address is the same as last school year, transportation should start on the student's first day of school.</p> <p>If a student's address has changed since last school year, transportation may not start on the student's first day of school. Communicate any changes to your school as soon as possible because your child may need to be assigned to a different bus stop.</p>

Additional Information

Students are generally assigned to centralized bus stops, which are in or near the student's town, often in a public place, and most likely, not within walking distance from the student's home. Families are notified of their child's specific transportation information, including:

- the start date
- bus stop location
- drop-off/pick-up times
- if the school participates in after-school transportation
