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4. Click Go Now on started.



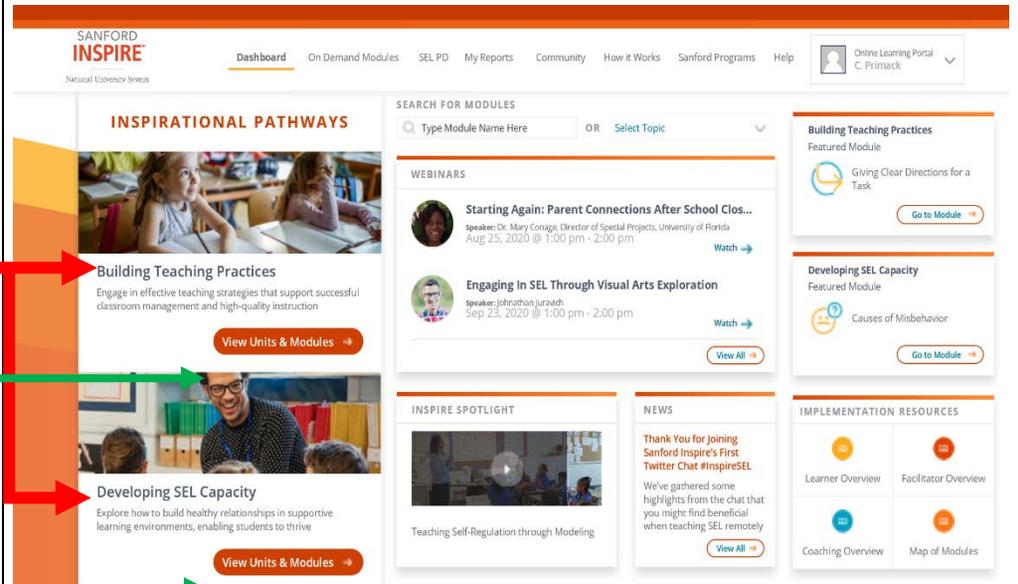

5. Modules are organized in two categories: **Building Teaching Practices** and **Developing SEL Capacity**.



To view the Modules within each unit, click on **View Units & Modules**



6. You can find a specific Module by using the **Search Tool**.

Type the name of the Module in the Search Bar

9. To preview a module, click on it.
