### **Overview**

The Government Fraud Section of the Connecticut Office of the Attorney General is seeking motivated and knowledgeable attorneys to join our team. The Government Fraud Section is dedicated to protecting Connecticut tax dollars from fraud, waste, abuse, and corruption. Duties of Government Program Fraud Section attorneys include: investigating and litigating complex, sensitive, and confidential civil matters under the Connecticut False Claims Act and other laws; partnering with other federal and state enforcement agencies and civilian fraud investigators; drafting subpoenas; analyzing documentary materials; conducting investigatory interviews; conducting settlement negotiations; and handling all aspects of litigation in federal and state courts, as well as administrative proceedings. Candidates will be selected from a pool of qualified applicants for [AAG I](#) and [AAG II](#) roles. Applications may be retained for future opportunities in the Government Fraud Section.
