HARTFORD – Attorney General George Jepsen has named a special counsel for legislative affairs and five others to his executive staff.

Robert W. Clark of Durham, an assistant attorney general in the Office’s special litigation department since 2004, was promoted to special counsel. Clark will represent the Attorney General before the General Assembly and the constitutional offices. A graduate of the University of Connecticut and the University of Connecticut School of Law, Clark has litigated some of the Office’s most significant and high-profile lawsuits.

Justin Kronholm of Chester will be liaison to the General Assembly, governmental agencies, municipal leaders and external groups and organizations. Kronholm served six years as executive assistant and director of community outreach for former Attorney General Richard Blumenthal. He is a graduate of the University of St. Thomas and Southern New England School of Law.

Susan E. Kinsman of East Haddam was named director of communications. An attorney and former reporter and editor, Kinsman is a graduate of the University of Connecticut and University of Connecticut School of Law.

Michael A. Martone of Branford will serve as executive policy advisor and counsel. Martone, a former assistant attorney general in the consumer protection department, is a graduate of Fairfield University and Quinnipiac University School of Law.

Cindy Dubuque of East Haven will serve as director of constituent services. A graduate of Wells College, she holds master’s degrees from Quinnipiac University and the University of Connecticut School of Social Work.

Anthony Krize of Monroe was named executive assistant. He is a graduate of the University of Connecticut.
