Dear Ambassador Huang Ping:

On behalf of the State of Connecticut, United States, we extend our warmest wishes to you and your family and hope this finds you in good health. The COVID-19 pandemic crisis continues to infect and cause harm to our fellow citizens. In Connecticut we are now experiencing widespread infections and increasing deaths as our state grapples with the immense challenge ahead of us. We know China continues to face this challenge and we hope the worst has passed. This virus does not discriminate between man or woman, adult or child, wealthy or poor, or Chinese or American. We will all need to come together to defeat this global threat.

Fortunately, Connecticut and China already enjoy a wonderful working relationship. In 2018, Connecticut exported over 1.5 billion dollars in goods and services to China and imported over 1.9 billion dollars in goods. Connecticut looks forward to continuing this relationship in its fight against COVID-19 and beyond. However, in order to keep fighting, Connecticut requires more Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) than what is currently available in the state. To that end, we humbly ask for any assistance you could offer us in clearing the way for securing more PPE for our healthcare professionals. We stand ready to follow-up on any suggestions you might have for increasing our access to your great country's manufacturing resources.
