BY THE AUTHORITY OF THE STATE OF CONNECTICUT, and more particularly by the authority granted to the Commissioner of Consumer Protection for the State of Connecticut by virtue of Conn. Gen. Stat. § 21a-190i(b), you are hereby commanded to appear for a deposition upon oral examination at the **Office of the Attorney General, 165 Capitol Avenue, 5th Floor, Hartford, Connecticut, 06106** on **June 30, 2026 at 9:30 am**, or on such other date and time as may be continued thereafter, and to bring with you the documentary materials set forth on Schedule A, attached hereto, which may be in your possession, custody, or control, or to which you may have reasonable access with regard to an investigation pursuant to the Solicitation of Charitable Funds Act, Conn. Gen. Stat. § 21a-175 et seq. The matters under investigation include, but are not limited to (a) the use of a checking account or accounts under the name, or for the benefit, of the Mayor’s Trophy Charitable Fund, including M&T Financial Account No. 2073320, any other financial account bearing the name “Mayor’s Trophy Charitable Fund” on any document or instrument associated with the account, including negotiable instruments, and any other account(s) used to hold charitably donated funds (collectively, the “Accounts”) and (b) the possible handling of, and accounting for, charitable gift assets.

Pursuant to Conn. Gen. Stat. § 21a-190i(b), you are commanded to testify concerning:

- a. the ownership and control of the Accounts;
- b. the establishment of the Accounts and the individual(s) and financial institution(s) involved;
- c. the establishment and administration of the donor advised fund at the Community Foundation of Greater New Britain named the Mayor’s Trophy Charitable Fund (the “DAF”);
- d. the solicitation and/or generation of donations for the DAF and/or other charitable uses; and

- e. the purpose, use, procedure, operations, and status of, and other matters concerning, the Accounts.

In addition, pursuant to Conn. Gen. Stat. § 21a-190i(b), you are commended to bring to the deposition upon oral examination the documents listed in Schedule A attached hereto. If you produce the documents listed in Schedule A seven days prior to the scheduled deposition, the deposition itself will be shorter.

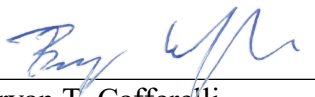

SCHEDULE A

Time Frame: This term refers to the period from January 1, 2020, to the present, if the account is still active, or to the closure of the account, if so closed.

1. Origination documents, including bank forms and signature cards, for (a) the M&T Account No. 2073320, (b) any other financial account bearing the name “Mayor’s Trophy Charitable Fund on any document or instrument associated with the account, including negotiable instruments, and (c) any other account(s) used to hold charitably donated funds.
2. Bank statements, including full copies of checks and deposit slips, for the Accounts for the months in which there was financial activity in the account, during the Time Frame.
3. Any bookkeeping list, ledger, journal, notes, or accounting regarding the Accounts and the charitable funds held within those accounts.
4. Any documents (including accountings), emails, text and instant messages, audio recordings, and transcripts of audio recordings identifying or related to fundraising efforts for the Mayor’s Trophy Charitable Fund, during the Time Frame.
5. Copies of any social media posts identifying, advertising, or otherwise related to fundraising efforts, events, or solicitations for the Mayor’s Trophy Charitable Fund, during the Time Frame.
6. Any documents or communications relating to or discussing the use of the Accounts or any previous financial account used for the same purpose, during the Time Frame.
