RESCISSION GUIDELINE CHART

B.O.P.P Form #2021

Effective 4/1/24

ACTIONS THAT MAY RESULT IN TEMPORARY SUSPENSION OF PAROLE & POSSIBLE RESCISSION HEARING:

- Significant Adverse Information to be determined by the Chairperson or designee regarding the offender received after the hearing resulting in the parole grant, but before the release on Transfer Parole or Discretionary Parole
- A serious act of misconduct to be determined by the Chairperson or designee before the release on Transfer Parole or Discretionary Parole
- Escape from Community Release
- Community Release Removal (excluding Return without Prejudice)
- Refusal to accept halfway house placement prior to release
- If the offender is arrested on a new criminal charge, parole release shall be held in abeyance pending disposition of the new criminal charge
- New Criminal Conviction where the behavior occurred during the time Special Parole was running and after revocation of parole

DISCIPLINARY REPORTS THAT REQUIRE TEMPORARY SUSPENSION OF PAROLE & RESCISSION HEARING:

- Arson
- Assault on DOC Employee
- Escape
- Felonious Misconduct
- Hostage Holding
- Hostage Holding or DOC Employee
- Impeding Order
- Public Indecency (Where ST score is 2 or above)
- Riot
- Sexual Misconduct (Where ST score is 2 or above)
- SRG or SRG Security Threat Member Designation
- Misdemeanant Conduct

SANCTIONING TIME FRAME TO BE CALCULATED BASED ON VOTED TO PAROLE DATE AND NOT THE DATE THE OFFENDER WAS REMANDED TO CUSTODY

ACTIONS THAT WILL RESULT IN AN ADMINISTRATIVE RESCISSION:


- **New Criminal Conviction:** If the new criminal conviction result is a sentence to serve that is greater than 2 years, then the offender's parole will be administratively rescinded and the offender will be scheduled for a discretionary hearing in accordance with the newly established parole eligibility date on that new sentence.
If a New Criminal Conviction occurs within 90 days of the end of sentence date or special parole end date, parole shall be auto-rescinded with no further consideration.

Upon review of any possible rescission, the Chairperson or designee has the discretion to determine that no action is required or if an off-set of no more than 120 days is appropriate.

Note: The Chairperson has the right to make exceptions on a case-by-case determination and deviate from the aforementioned guidelines.
