

The Bartlett was later coming out  
1945 and was not killed back, but was  
injured some by a later frost - June. No crops.

Temp. down to 25° below Feb '44

1934 low 34° below.

Most native chinquapin here has only crop. It's  
hardy.

Also has 2 old originals that were  
with about 76 trees, and growing near evergreen  
garden and near computer pole. Are very hardy,  
in fact, Bartlett said the first ships are the  
hardest. These 2 were formerly in the orchard.

BROMLEY, STANLEY W. The frost of April 23, 1945. Trees 6(3):  
p. 11. August 1945

" . . . Along the Sound at Stamford there was very little frost  
injury as the temperature here was about 45° F in most places.  
The grounds of the Bartlett Tree Research Laboratories are located  
about eight miles north of the Sound with an elevation of over  
400 feet. There is frequently a spread of 10° between condi-  
tions here and on the Sound.
