

This chestnut tree located on roadside on North Ave., Rochester, Mass. opposite the estate of Mrs. C. W. Maxim. It is about 15 feet high with 3 or 4 trunks about 2" thick.

This year (1933) two burrs were found on the tree with nuts about size of ordinary American chestnut but withered.

The tree apparently is free from blight.

It is close by to the one shown in other photograph.

2/1/35 - Tree came thru winter OK. not crop last fall. No blight.

The chestnut tree located on roadside on North Ave., Rochester Mass opposite the estate of Mrs. C. W. Maxim. Several nuts were sent from this tree in 1931 to Dept of Agriculture Wash. D. C.

The trunk is about a foot in dia. and tree is partially killed by blight but has survived and bears large sized nuts, some about 2" in dia.

The trunk of this tree branches off close to the ground.

This tree is about 20 feet high.
