POSITION ANNOUNCEMENT

Research Farm Supervisor

CAES- Griswold Research Center, Griswold, Connecticut

The Connecticut Agricultural Experiment Station is seeking applicants for a research farm supervisor at The Experiment Station's research center in Griswold, Connecticut. The Farm Supervisor will be responsible for the overall operation of the research center, including the maintenance of crop systems, machinery, grounds, buildings, barns, and farm records. Duties will include assisting scientists in the design, layout, and management of field research plots, as well as research center administration; field preparation; planting; metered application of irrigation, fertilizers, and pesticides; measurement of crop yields; and supervision of seasonal staff. Minimum qualifications include a BS in agriculture or a related field and 2 years of relevant farming or related experience, or two years or more of college with four years of farming or related experience. A motor vehicle and pesticide applicator's license is required. The position is full-time (35 hours per week) with a starting salary of \$73,032 plus medical, dental, and retirement benefits. Candidates should submit electronically in one PDF file: **1)** a letter of interest and qualifications, **2)** a resume, **3)** copies of college transcripts (official or unofficial), if applicable, and **4)** names and contact information of three professional references. Applications will be accepted until the position is filled, but should be submitted no later than May 1, 2026, for full consideration.
