SEASONAL RESEARCH ASSISTANT

Department of Environmental Science & Forestry

Two Seasonal Research Assistant (CAES) positions are available with the Invasive Aquatic Plant Program (IAPP)/Office of Aquatic Invasive Species (OAIS). Both positions require documenting vegetation in lakes and ponds. A background in the natural sciences is essential. The successful candidate will assist the principal investigator in aquatic plant surveys. Additional responsibilities include pressing, mounting, and cataloguing aquatic plants, and testing water. Outstanding interpersonal skills are needed for interacting with the public and CAES IAPP team. Must be comfortable working full days in the laboratory or out in the field and possess a valid driver's license. Boating experience is preferred and the ability to swim is necessary for safety on the water. Candidates must be organized, detail oriented, self-motivated, and resourceful. Computer skills include MS Word, Excel, and PowerPoint. Experience with ArcGIS and webpage editing are a plus. The positions are available from May through October 2023 but can be shortened to accommodate school schedules. The salary is \$15/hour for a 35-hour work week.
