1. Notice of Time Extension for Post-Scoping Notice for Bozrah Sanitary Sewer Extension Project

Addresses of Possible Project Locations: The project is located along Fitchville Road, Stockhouse Road, River Road, Rachel Drive, Commerce Park Road on State Route 87 in Bozrah, and in State Routes 87 and 32 in Franklin. It will connect to the Town of Franklin sewer system on Route 32 in Franklin.

Municipalities where proposed action would be located: Bozrah and Franklin

Connecticut Environmental Policy Act (CEPA) Determination: On November 8, 2022, the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (DEEP) published a [Notice of Scoping](#) to solicit public comments for this action in the *Environmental Monitor*. DEEP is unable to publish its determination regarding this action at this time.

Action Status: Awaiting additional information from the towns.

Estimated Publication Date: DEEP estimates that a Post-Scoping Notice will be published in the *Environmental Monitor* on or before July 8, 2023.
