6. Cold Water Rescue Training – Space Still Available

The Connecticut Fire Academy still has seats available in the upcoming *Cold Water Rescue* training program being held in Burlington. This two day program is designed for first responders who may be called to operate at the scene of a cold water or ice rescue. Topics covered include: pre-planning; risk assessment; ice types; hypothermia; cold water drowning; water rescue equipment; and rescue operations. Participants will perform simulated rescues in cold water and ice (if available) using cold water entry suits and associated equipment. The course fee is \$75.00.
