Also included within the standard by reference is the NFPA 472 "Standards for Competence of Responders to Hazardous Materials/Weapons of Mass Destruction Incidents" 2013 edition. Students must attend all sessions and complete all assignments to qualify for the state exams. The exams will consist of a practical skills assessment followed by a cognitive written exam. The Commission on Fire Prevention and Control, Office of Certification will conduct all examinations. Fees for all examinations are included in the registration fee and include State of Connecticut and National Certification fees.


